Dear ICC Board of Directors,

The ICC Los Angeles Basin Chapter represents 89 jurisdictions in Southern California. Established back in 1957, our membership has been active and is very familiar with the code adoption process going back to the era of the International Conference of Building Officials organization (I.C.B.O.) administering the Uniform Codes.

On February 12, 2009 and during its scheduled monthly business meeting, the ICC Los Angeles Basin Chapter unanimously voted 62 to 0 to oppose the implementation of changes to the code adoption process without the approval of the ICC membership. The motion that was passed stated the following:

“ICC Los Angeles Basin Chapter strongly opposes the implementation of the changes to the code adoption process until the changes are ratified by a vote of the ICC membership. If ICC membership vote does not ratify the changes, ICC Los Angeles Basin Chapter requests that the code change process not be implemented until the ICC membership ratifies the code change process.”

While expressing our concern about the proposed changes, The ICC Los Angeles Basin Chapter would like to affirm it's commitment to an open and inclusive code development process and its membership stands in solidarity and support with ICC in considering a revised process that will be prudent to all.
